We are lifelong learners

Our Adult RE program is designed to allow for engagement with both structured curriculum (1st and 3rd Sundays) as well as other formats: Small Group Ministry (4th Sundays) and social justice engagement (2nd and 5th Sundays). Our curricula speak to the head (What We Choose on 1st Sundays) as well the heart (Spirit of Life on 3rd Sundays). Together, these offerings provide varied themes and modalities for participants to deepen engagement with UU values and relationship with each other. I hope you will drop in on a session that is new to you during the new year. Also, please thank our Adult RE Coordinator, Julia Sexton, as well as those who are anchoring the program, Tina Harmuth, Jane Collins, Ashley Newlin, and Laurie Mikitka.

Children's and Youth Programming Elementary age Children and High School youth continue to engage the multi-age curriculum Circle of Trees.
