

"Oh, look, The Love People are here" ~Reverend Susan Frederick Gray, then a parish minister in Phoenix, shared how community activists described Unitarian Universalists showing up for justice in their vellow Side with Love t-shirts. The shirts, an outward symbol of our inward fire, tell the world what we are about. This summer, the UUA will vote on changes to our bylaws that shift emphasis from principles to values, with the central core value being love. Over the next few months, I will be sharing information about the new proposed Article II as well as inviting exploration of the proposed core values and how they relate to the 8 principles while we refresh the bulletin board across from Jaggers.
