President's Message

Our Annual Spring Stewardship drive will start this coming Sunday, March 5th. Be sure to come for potluck and stewardship kick off. Michael Zepeda gave a great speech introducing the drive last Sunday. Our new fiscal year starts July 1. We do a Spring Stewardship Drive and make a new budget that is presented at the Congregational Meeting in May.

There will be a pledge packet for each household available Sunday. I ask that you fill the pledge card out with the amount you can donate to the church next year. Please consider what you can do for APC. In donating money and in giving time. There is a slot on the pledge card to write down volunteer hours you expect to do. We have 65 pledging households. The average pledge is \$2,320, median is \$1,200. Last fiscal year's total pledge was \$127,779. Our total income was \$183,820 and includes Sunday plate, rent and grants.

I want our church to do more. I want to have a minister to lead us. I want volunteers to help with the service, work on the potluck, and teach Sunday School. More classes and groups meeting. Let's use this great building we have. Sunday Mar 19 after service we will give a building and grounds tour.

Where will our All Peoples Church family go? What will we do? What resources do we need to get there? Let's talk about it this coming month.

I enjoyed some great preaching at the Proctor Conference ("the social justice network") this past week. Tag-team preachers Dr. Brandon Crowley and Rev. Teresa Lynn Fry Brown gracing the pulpit of Ebenezer Baptist Church, exhorted us to think about "sanctified succession" and true mentorship, mentorship that is not jealous or holding power and control. Rather, mentors who empty themselves out to give their mentees not just information, but also spiritual depth, support, and learnings gleaned from experience that can provide a springboard to greater personal and organizational strength. What's your lineage? Who has mentored you into the roles that you play with the congregation and in other contexts? And how are you mentoring others?

"The arc of the moral universe is long, but it bends towards justice". The Reverend Doctor Martin Luther King Jr. uttered these words in one of his more famous speeches. He did not originate this idea. He paraphrased it from a one hundred year old sermon by Unitarian minister and fervent abolitionist the Reverend Theodore Parker.

They lied. The arc does not bend toward Justice. It does not bend period unless we do the bending. As Thomas Jefferson noted in the Declaration of Independence

"... all experience hath shewn that Mankind are more disposed to suffer, while Evils are sufferable, than to right themselves by abolishing the Forms to which they are accustomed."

Our Chosen Faith requires us, as the great Civil Rights leader John Lewis put it, "to make good trouble". It is the only way to bend the arc of toward justice.
