Religious Education News

We are lifelong learners

The Texas legislative session is maddening and overwhelming. Unfortunately, there are a lot of bills (over 140) being heard that target LGBTQ+ people for harm, and they are moving swiftly through the legislative process. There are many more that pander to other culture war issues that threaten to overwhelm potentially good legislation, such as bills that would improve maternal health outcomes. I was in Austin on Monday evening and Tuesday with the Texas Freedom Network and saw first-hand hearings on a bill which would interfere with parents' ability to access life-saving healthcare for their trans kids. One of the speakers at Tuesday's rally, a state representative, said that she knocked on a lot of doors last year and one of the most common things that she hears is along the lines of: "is that really happening? It sounds hyperbolic." You may know and be a trusted resource for people who feel similarly. There is a lot of bad stuff happening and it's real. How do Unitarian Universalist values inform our responsibilities in this moment? What are we called to do and who are we called to be in this moment?
