# **President's Message**

The Banned Book Summer Camp that Sarah Berel-Harrop hosted last Saturday went well. Sarah did all of Sunday with All Peoples Con and a rousing Sunday service.

Community UU Church in Plano has had an incident. Around 12am on July 23 someone put a firebomb against their front door. Fire alarm system notified fire department and they quickly put it out after moderate damage. No one was injured. A disruptive group had attended church Sun Jun 25 then posted videos to social media. Police are looking into it. A targeted attack against our sister church is very disturbing. I wonder if we could take a special collection to help them with repair costs and show our solidarity. We need to be extra aware for our safety and review our safety procedures. Daniel Polk of NTUUC says they will send out recommendations for a safety checklist.

We have purchased security cameras which will be installed soon. The Board authorized this after our AC was damaged in 3 incidents. Our renters, Fort Worth Sudbury also donated an additional camera since building security is in our mutual interest.
