We are lifelong learners

We are so excited for the new congregational year in Lifespan Religious Education. All Regular Religious Education Programming, for Adults, Youth, and Children, begins at 9:45 AM. Tools for self-care and spiritual growth include tending several aspects of the whole person:

Cognitive – what we think,

Emotional-what we feel,

Social - how we relate to each other in groups,

Physical—how we engage our bodies, and

Spiritual—our engagement with the divine or with ultimate meaning

Our balanced program offers the opportunity to engage in these various ways. Adults may choose between the Adult RE offerings listed below, Adventures in Religion, or, accompanying their children or youth to Family-Style Religious Education. For children and youth, rather than a structured, sequential curriculum we invite the whole family to participate in rotating session formats. For everyone, we will explore an overarching monthly Soul Matters theme in Religious Education as well as in Worship. September's theme is **Welcome** as we welcome each other back to our beloved community and welcome in the new congregational year!

Religious Education Programming

All Religious Education programming begins at 9:45AM on Sunday mornings.

Family-Style Religious Education Programming

We will have a rotating format by week for Elementary, Middle School, and High School during the Religious Education hour. Adults may join their children or youth, or participate in another aspect of our morning programming.

September 3RD—Gather the Spirit. We'll explore myriad ways of expressing spirituality. *This week:* We will explore labyrinths with a special guest, Rosalyn Hunter!

September 10TH—Song Sung Sunday. We'll sing and listen to songs, including the story behind the music. This month: Soul Matters theme—*Welcome!*

September 17^{TH} – Explorations into science and the natural world.

September 18TH—And Now, for Something Completely Different. We'll nurture a sense of play and joy; important aspects of resilience and spiritual development.

Nursery: Our nursery is open during worship for children under 8 and during the RE hour for children not participating in scheduled curriculum.

In this role, Jessica focuses on increasing civic participation amongst young people and works to cultivate lifelong voters by helping to establish student-led civic engagement clubs on high school campuses. Currently, there are 28 Student Voter Empowerment Clubs across the metroplex (with close to 200 students participating), and she hopes to expand that opportunity to more campuses in the coming months and years

We approach spiritual practices from a pluralistic and interfaith perspective. We approach each person's spirituality with curiosity, wonder and mutual respect.
